Tips for staying safe

- Use a strong password (e.g. three random words to make a passphrase) and avoid writing it down anywhere.
- Be wary of email links and attachments from unknown sources and, if in doubt, check with the sender before you click or open them.
- Do not use public Wi-Fi for sensitive data (e.g. personal banking).





AT WORK



Don't leave devices logged on and unattended.



Don't plug your personal phone or device into your computer.



Don't share login information or passwords.



Don't log in to your personal email or social media account at work.



Don't plug an unknown USB stick or other unknown media into your computer.



AT HOME



Use antivirus software and accept any updates promptly.



Keep track of your digital footprint (e.g. which websites are storing your credit card information).



Change the network name and pre-set password on your wireless router.



Back up your data by making an electronic copy and storing it safely.



Never use pirated software or free software other than from a reputable source.
