Public Health Enhanced Services 2015/16

A number of changes in regards to either the administration or claiming mechanism(s) have been made to the vaccination and immunisation programmes for 2015/16.

This section sets out which programmes continue without alteration, those where there have been some changes made whilst advising you of potential new programmes being introduced in 2015/16. (*Appendix 1 provides a detailed explanation and claiming guidance relevant to the services*).

The following programmes continue unchanged:

- **Hepatitis B** (*newborn babies*)
- **MMR** (*aged 16 and over*)
- **Rotavirus** (*Babies*)
- **Seasonal influenza** (*aged 65 and over, including 'At Risk' patients*)
- **Shingles** (*Routine*)

The following programmes have been subject to some changes:

- **Childhood immunisation** (*Routine*)
- **Childhood immunisation** (PCV) (*Pneumococcal Vaccine – Hib/MenC*)
- **Childhood influenza** (*Increased cohort*)
- **Human Papillomavirus vaccine** (HPV) (*eligible cohort of female patients*)
- **Pertussis** (*pregnant women*) - *The pertussis (pregnant women) vaccination programme, does not have supporting guidance but the specification provides further details.*
- **Meningococcal C** (MenC) (*new students*) – *may be replaced with MenW containing vaccine*
- **Pneumococcal** (PPV) (*aged 65 and over, including At Risk patients*)
- **Shingles catch-up**

New: **Meningococcal W** and **Meningococcal B** vaccination programme to be introduced in 2015/16:

- Meningococcal group W (MenW) disease** - Following a rapid increase in meningococcal group W (MenW) disease in England, the JCVI recommended an emergency programme to vaccinate all 14-18 years-olds (school years 10-13) with a quadrivalent MenACWY conjugate vaccine to provide direct and herd protection to the whole population.

PHE is asking GPs to delay the current MenC Freshers programme due to start in April because of the current MenW outbreak. PHE is urgently trying to procure sufficient MenACWY vaccine to vaccinate those currently in Year 13 over the summer period. This will avoid the need to revaccinate this group to provide additional protection against MenW.

The priority group to be immunised will be the current Year 13 students (probably) through primary care. A two year catch up programme is likely as soon as vaccine is available, in 2016-17 this is likely to be through school immunisation programmes to Year 9 students along with their school leaver booster (replacing MenC) and Year 13 plus one other year group (either Year 10, 11, 12).
- Meningococcal group B (MenB) disease** - A three dose Meningococcal B vaccine will be introduced into the childhood immunisation programme with a provision start date of 1st September 2015. The immunisation will be given with the current immunisations scheduled at the ages of 2 months, 4 months and 12 months of age. Potentially babies born after the 1st May 2015 will receive the vaccine. Communications material and a PGD are in production at national level.

GP Practices wishing to participate in any/all of the Enhanced Services will be required to complete and sign the Enhanced Service Agreement (page 4) and return to NHS England, Yorkshire and the Humber (South Yorkshire & Bassetlaw team) via post or email to england.syb-phclaims@nhs.net no later than **22nd May 2015**.

Claiming Mechanism(s)

With effect from 1st April 2015:

Childhood Pneumococcal Vaccine – Hib/MenC immunisations will need to be submitted quarterly using the excel claim form issued, by the 15th of the following month to england.syb-phclaims@nhs.net

Reimbursement for all other Public Health Enhanced Services will be processed through the Calculating Quality Reporting Service (CQRS). CQRS is an automated system used to calculate achievement and payments following monthly GP Practice submissions.

All GP practices participating in any of these Enhanced Services will still be required to enter data manually onto CQRS until extractions via General Practice Extraction Service (GPES) are fully operational/available (e.g. Rotavirus). All manual CQRS claims must be submitted no later than the 15th of the following month.

Where required, practices must make available any relevant information for audit purpose. Claims not submitted within 6 months of the administration of the final completing vaccination will not be eligible for payment.
